


MASS WILL BE CELEBRATED DAILY

Day 1: Saturday, January 14, 2017, USA / TEL AVIV
Tour members are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to Tel Aviv via wide-body aircraft, arriving the next morning. Meals served on board.

Day 2: Sunday 1/15, TEL AVIV / CAESAREA / MT CARMEL / TIBERIAS



Upon our arrival in Tel Aviv, we travel northeast to **Caesarea** on the Mediterranean Sea. There, we view the **Roman aqueduct and port, Crusader's Moat and the ruins of the ancient**

amphitheater next to the ocean. It was in Caesarea that Paul was imprisoned, tried, and sent from this Mediterranean harbor to Rome. From there, we proceed to Haifa and stop for Holy Mass at the **Stella Maris, Our Lady of Mount Carmel** (subject to confirmation) and the home of the prophet, Elijah. From Tiberias we have a splendid view of the city and the Sea of Galilee. Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Monday 1/16, TIBERIAS / CANA / NAZARETH / MT TABOR / TIBERIAS



This morning, we travel to **Cana**, where Jesus performed his first miracle, changing the water into wine. If you wish, you may renew your wedding vows as a lasting remembrance of Cana. Our next stop is **Nazareth**, where Jesus played, grew up amongst the other children of the city, and later worked with Joseph in carpentry. It is here in the **Basilica of the Annunciation** just behind the altar where you can

see the grotto that is the room where Mary said "yes" to the angel of the Lord. Next, we visit **St. Joseph's carpentry shop and Mary's Well** and then **Mt. Tabor**, site of the Transfiguration. We return to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 4: Tuesday 1/17, TIBERIAS / BET SHEAN / MT OF BEATITUDES / CAESAREA PHILIPPI (BANIAS) / TIBERIAS
Today, we visit **Bet Shean**, where King Saul and his sons were pinned to the walls. It became the Decapolis Capital visited by Jesus and known as the Scythopolis. See the **ancient theatre, Circus Maximus and Cardo Maximo**. From there, we proceed to the **Mount**

of Beatitudes where we enjoy some tranquil and contemplative time to ourselves. Next, we stop at **Caesarea Philippi (Banias)**, location where Jesus declared Peter "Rock" and entrusted him with the keys to the kingdom of Heaven. Our day concludes as we return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]


Day 5: Wednesday 1/18, TIBERIAS / CAPERNAUM / TABGHA / ST PETER'S PRIMACY / SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS

Our day begins in **Capernaum**. This is the town where Peter lived and within which Jesus made his base of operations for His Galilean ministry. As we visit the **ruins of the town** you will find out why Jesus focused his ministry here, where ancient Judaism flourished. We will visit the **Synagogue** where Jesus healed and taught, and also **Peter's house**. We will celebrate Mass at Peter's house (subject to confirmation) in Capernaum before heading to **Tabgha**, location of the miracle of the loaves and fish. Located nearby is the **Church of St. Peter's Primacy**, where Jesus appeared after the Resurrection. We visit there before taking a relaxing boat ride on the **Sea of Galilee**. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 6: Thursday 1/19, TIBERIAS / SHEIK HUSSEIN BRIDGE / JERASH / AMMAN

After breakfast, we travel south along the Jordan River to the **Sheik Hussein Bridge**, our entryway into Jordan. We proceed to Jerash, a well-preserved Roman city to see the **Temple of Artemis, Temple of Zeus, and an incredible view of the Forum**. Then we complete today's journey as we arrive in **Amman**, where we enjoy a **sightseeing tour of Jordan's capitol city**, including the **ruins of the ancient civilizations, the Citadel, and the Roman Temple of Hercules**. We check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 7: Friday 1/20, AMMAN / PETRA / AMMAN




This morning, we enjoy a **sightseeing tour of Petra**, the Nabatean city and new wonder of the world. The city, rediscovered in 1812, earned its nickname because the city is largely carved in colored sandstone. We will travel, on foot or horseback, from the **El Ji Post** and through the **Siq (natural gorge)** to visit the **treasury, theater, Palace of Justice and other amazing sites**. Those who wish to skip this part of the journey are free to sit back and enjoy the scenery until the others return. We return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 8: Saturday 1/21, AMMAN / MADABA / MT NEBO / ALLENBY BRIDGE / JERUSALEM
We depart Amman this morning and travel to the Roman Byzantine town of **Madaba** (biblical Medeba). This Christian town is home to a mosaic map of Jordan, Jerusalem and Egypt. We visit **Mount Nebo**, the location where Moses saw the Promised Land. Moses spent his


final days and was laid to rest here. Then, we visit the **sanctuary at Nebo**. This is one of the most revered holy sites of Jordan. As our journey continues we cross over the **Allenby Bridge** into Jerusalem. We proceed to Jerusalem to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 9: Sunday 1/22, JERUSALEM



ives to Dominus Flevit Chapel, where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. We proceed to the **Garden of Gethsemane** and the **Church of All Nations**, where Jesus endured his Agony. Next, we stop at **Dormition Abbey**. From there, we view the **Knesset (Israeli Parliament)** as we make our way to view (briefly) the **Model of the City of Jerusalem** at the time of Jesus and visit (briefly) the **Shrine of the Book**, where we see the Dead Sea Scrolls on display. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 10: Monday 1/23, JERUSALEM




After breakfast, we visit the **New City of Jerusalem, Mount Zion, the Upper Room, and the tomb of King David**. From there, we drive to **Bethlehem** to visit the **Church of the Nativity, the Manger, the Crusader's Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome**. We then visit the **cave in Shepherd's Field** and view the **Fields of Boaz**. En route to Jerusalem we see the **Tomb of Rachel**. Pilgrims will have an opportunity to spend some time **shopping in Bethlehem** before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 11: Tuesday 1/24, JERUSALEM / MASADA / JERUSALEM

Today, we stop briefly in **Jericho**, the world's oldest city, on our way to Masada. In **Masada**, we **ascend by cable car** to the magnificent **ruins of the fortress** where, from 70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean revolt against Rome. We see the remains of storehouses, cisterns and a sixth-century Byzantine church. On our return to Jerusalem, we make a brief stop at the **shore of the Dead Sea**, 1,300 feet below sea level (the lowest spot on earth). From there, we proceed to the

excavations of Qumran, the Essene community connected with John the Baptist and the site of the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 12: Wednesday 1/25, JERUSALEM



This morning, we **prayerfully follow the Via Dolorosa** (Stations of the Cross) through the old city to the **Church of the Holy Sepulchre**, where we pray on top the **Rock of Calvary**, inside the **Lord's tomb** and celebrate Holy Mass (subject to confirmation). This afternoon, we proceed to **Ein Karem**, home of Saints Elizabeth and Zachariah

and birthplace of John the Baptist, and the **Church of the Visitation**, where Mary uttered the words of the Magnificat. From there we visit **Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of Flagellation, Lithostrotos, and the Arch of Ecce Homo** ("Behold the Man") and the **Convent of the Sisters of Zion**. Dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 13: Thursday 1/26, JERUSALEM / LOD / TEL AVIV

This morning visit the **Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu** (The Cock Crows). We will celebrate Mass (subject to confirmation) in this beautiful church where Jesus was held in the house of the High Priest Caiaphas. We enter the **Old City through the Zion Gate** and see the **Cardo** and the **remains of Nehemiah's Wall**. We visit the **Davidson Center** and visit the **Church of St. Anne** and the **Pool of Bethesda**. This afternoon, en route to Tel Aviv we stop in **Lod (Lydda)** to visit the **sites of St. George**. The most important soldier-saint in Christian tradition, St. George was born and lived in Lod in the 3rd century AD. He was a victim of persecution for his faith and suffered a gruesome death. Today, the remains of the martyr can be found in the crypt of the Greek Orthodox Church. We visit the **church and St. George Monastery** where the Christian monks continue to practice the ancient way of life. Our journey continues as we arrive in Tel Aviv where we will enjoy a **farewell dinner at a local restaurant** before we head to the **Ben Gurion Airport** for our overnight flight back to the United States. [B,D]

Day 14: Friday, January 27, 2017, TEL AVIV / USA

We arrive home today with unforgettable memories, knowing we have walked in the footsteps of Jesus and the early Christians. Such a memorable tour will bring new meaning to our Christian life.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 4/11/2016 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$69 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Eleven full hot breakfasts and twelve dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. **Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.**

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: 1: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$719); 2: tips to guides and drivers, meal servers and luggage handlers (\$174.50); and 3: optional travel insurance. **An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice.** Also not included: domestic baggage fees, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. Note: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Domestic baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the **balance to be paid in full no later than 10/14/2016.** Payment of remaining balance received after 10/14/2016 will incur a \$50 penalty. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge. In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 9/16/2016 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties. From 9/16/2016 to 10/14/2016 the cancellation penalty is \$500 plus any airline cancellation penalties. If cancellation is received after 10/14/2016, refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater. There will be no refund for cancellations within 33 days of departure. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Chicago/Tel Aviv and Tel Aviv/Chicago on economy class jet via United or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 10/14/2016, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

INSURANCE: Insurance is NOT included in the tour price. Because of the cost of medical care outside the United States, the fact that Medicare does not provide coverage outside the United States, the possibility that your own insurance provider may not cover you outside the United States, and due to the potentially high cost of escorted air evacuation, travel insurance is strongly recommended. Consequently, for the protection of our clients, you will be mailed a travel insurance brochure/policy along with an insurance waiver form in the event you choose to decline coverage. The effective date of coverage will be the date that the insurance premium is paid and not the date of the initial deposit.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. United and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

MISCELLANEOUS FEES: All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 92 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

ERRORS: The Pentecost Tours staff does its best to provide you with accurate billing, brochures, etc. However, in the event of computer error, verbal or written human errors, we reserve the right to invoice, re-invoice, or forward corrected materials.


